2010 Development Award: Kamloops Long Blades

The Long Blades Short Track Speed Skating Club was founded in 1992 by former speed skater Sandi Vyse, her mother, Phyllis Vyse, Bill Zirnhelt and Sharon Wall. Making sports accessible to girls is the goal of the club and they ensure that girls are participating at all levels. Recognizing that it is important to have female role models, the club works to encourage young women to become coaches and officials. This award will enable the club to support the training and certification of 6 women to become starters and referees. Once trained at level 2, these women will officiate in local competitions, and the club plans to develop their skills further to officiate at provincial, national and international competitions.

The **Career Achievement Award** recognizes mature outstanding role models who have, over the course of their career championed women in sport and physical activity. (no cash disbursement).

The **Development Award** of \$1500 is given to an individual or organization for a new or existing program or for professional development which champions women in sport and physical activity.
