Sport BC will be celebrating the 54th Annual Athlete of the Year Awards virtually on **Thursday, March 25, 2021.** The event is a pre-taped show hosted by CBC's Scott Russell and will recognize the province's best in amateur sport including athletes, coaches, teams, and officials for outstanding performances in their sport over the 2019 season. Each finalist was nominated by their Provincial or Multi-Sport Organization, High School, College, or University. The Selection Committee, led by long-serving Chair Bernie Pascall, included a diverse group of highly experienced British Columbia sport leaders and media members.
