FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This financial summary and the table below are based on the audited consolidated financial statements of Sport BC and SBC Insurance Ltd. for the year ended March 31, 2024. The financial statements and accompanying notes are available on our website at SportBC.com.

Sport BC realized a net operating surplus of \$326,614 for its fiscal year ended March 31, 2024 (2023 – \$254,423) and total excess of revenues over expenses of \$549,946 (2023 – \$85,256) and ended its fiscal year with net assets of \$5,576,838 (2023 – \$5,026,892). Included in net assets is Sport BC's investment in a balanced managed mutual fund with a fair value of \$3,538,706 at March 31, 2021 (2023 – \$3,198,788) – almost \$1.1 million more than its initial cost value of \$2,450,00 with an annualized return of 5.7% since inception. The fund has approximately 62% of its portfolio invested in a mix of Canadian and international equity securities, 33% in fixed income instruments, and 5% in cash equivalents.

Total consolidated revenue for FY2024 was \$3.1 million vs \$2.6 million in the previous fiscal year, an increase of \$0.5 million due to:

- Insurance revenue +\$365k on a mix of new business, increase in events, and premium increases;
- Corporate support & fundraising +\$273k largely based on KidSport's 50/50 draw partnership with the Vancouver Whitecaps;
- Provincial funding -\$37k as 50/50 and other government support of \$165k reduced requirement to recognize provincial funding for KidSport to break even in the year;
- Other government support -\$206 on \$165k in CSAI funding in FY2024 vs \$371k in prior year;
- Net investment income +\$63k on continued hither rates and increased capital gains and other distributions from the investment fund; and
- Fees for service +\$3k on increased payroll activity.

Expenses totalled \$2.7 million, an increase of almost 0.4 million vs fiscal 2023 driven mainly by:

- KidSport + \$314k on an increase of \$247k in grants and \$66k in operational costs mostly related to 50/50 program transaction costs;
- Provincial Funding Initiative costs -\$208k due a decrease in programming activity;
- Insurance operations +\$145k on increased staff, overhead, and commission costs as well as income taxes; and
- Leadership & operations +\$105 due mainly to a headcount addition and increased costs related to in-person events.

PAYROLL AND BENEFIT SERVICES

Sport BC provides top-of-the-line payroll and group benefit services to our members and affiliates at competitive rates. Sport BC provides these services on a break-even basis without an intent to earn profit.

Payroll services include:

- Direct deposit into each employees' bank account;
- WCB reporting and remittances;
- Retirement account contributions and matching per client policy;
- T4 and T4A filings;
- Statutory deductions and remittances to clients' RP accounts;
- CRA Authorized Representative services to administer clients' RP accounts if requested.

For group benefits, we provide the following services:

- Administration of comprehensive benefit package through Canada Life including:
 - Life insurance
 - Accidental death & dismemberment (AD&D) coverage
 - Critical illness coverage
 - Employee assistance program (EAP)
 - Short-term and long-term disability (STD and LTD)
 - Extended health and dental, including Consult+, a virtual health & wellness clinic.

In calendar 2023, Sport BC provided payroll services to 64 PSOs and clubs (2022 – 64), processing total payroll over \$19.5 million for 554 employees (2022 – \$17.0 million for 534 employees). Sport BC also administered extended benefits through Canada Life for 204 plan participants for 47 PSOs and clubs (2022 – 201 participants with 50 PSOs and clubs).

We look forward to continuing to offer our clients an exceptional level of service going forward and doing what we can to assist in an ever-changing labour market landscape. In June 2022, we distributed Sport BC's 2022 Sport Sector Talent Survey to our members which included insights on sector compensation, benefits, and organizational structure. We look forward to conducting a similar and enhanced survey in 2024.



BC AMATEUR Sport Fund

The BC Amateur Sport Fund is a chapter of the Canadian Council of Provincial and Territorial Sports Federations, a registered Canadian amateur athletic association (RCAAA). BCASF can issue an official tax receipt for qualifying donations. This provides the opportunity to solicit support for amateur sport projects.

The Fund enables Sport BC members and their clubs to diversify their revenue streams through fundraising from private sources including individuals, corporations, and foundations. Sport organizations may register a project with the Fund, allowing them to solicit donations to benefit their approved project. Projects can support operating, program-specific, capital (e.g., facilities, equipment) and scholarship/bursary costs, or any combination of these areas.

Sport BC has hosted a number of events to help educated members about the opportunity to diversify revenue through the BCASF such as four Revenue Development Workshops and enhanced member meetings focusing on the fund. Sport BC upgraded the fund section of sportbc.com so potential donors to the fund can now search by sport, member, organization, and project name.



SPORT BC STRATEGIC PLAN 2022-2026

The activities and priorities of the Sport BC team are guided by the Sport BC Strategic Plan for 2022 through 2026 which represents the collective efforts of our board, members, advocacy working group, BC Women and Sport committee, KidSport leaders, and senior staff. Along with the additional priorities outlined in the diagram below, the Plan clearly shows Sport BC will continue to strongly advocate for and serve our members and stakeholders as well as provide programs that support a strong, diverse and equitable sport environment in BC.





Sport BC Insurance posted another record year of earnings based on the new commission income from securing new customer accounts. The most relevant was obtaining the insurance account for Sport Manitoba along with all its Provincial, Disability and Multi Sport partners. This was a significant win for SBCI and is a demonstration of the strong understanding that Sport BC/SBCI have in the unique space of sport insurance. Specifically, issues regarding the needs and risks of the sport sector not only in the province of B.C. and our membership base, but also for the sector in Canada.

With significant growth, a key priority is the importance of maintaining strong service standards for our membership and new clients as we take on new accounts. Also understanding that SBCI needs to continue to grow to provide a strong consistent revenue stream to support Sport BC to offer sustainable programming and services on behalf of our membership and the sector at large.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the member clients of SBCI for their support and loyalty over this past year and understanding the value proposition that comes from purchasing their insurance products through SBCI.





A key accomplishment over the last year is the establishment of a new name and logo for ProMOTION Plus. Sport BC members and other stakeholders provided feedback for the organization, name and brand and we are proud to move forward being known as BC Women and Sport. The new name makes it easier for people both internal and external to understand the purpose of the organization.

The BC Women and Sport working committee meets regularly to ensure the priority of recognition, advocacy, and the In Her Footsteps Hall of Fame exhibit are on track as well as planning additional initiatives and events. BC Women and Sport continues to be committed to increasing opportunities for girls and women in physical activity and sport.

The KidSport concept was launched in 1993 by board and staff at Sport BC as a way to help address the challenges faced by many families when registering their children in organized sport. From a modest start in that first year, KidSport has since expanded across the country to become a national entity with 11 provincial/territorial chapters and over 160 community chapters.

Thirty years later, KidSport BC, with support from local community chapters across the province, has funded a season of sport for over 80,000 kids totaling more than \$19 million in grants.


