FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This financial summary and the table below are based on the review engagement consolidated financial statements of Sport BC and SBC Insurance Ltd. for the year ended March 31, 2025.

Sport BC realized a net operating surplus of \$206,401 for its fiscal year ended March 31, 2025 (2024 – \$326,614) and total excess of revenues over expenses of \$432,457 (2024 – \$549,946) and ended its fiscal year with net assets of \$6,009,295 (2024 – \$5,576,838). Included in net assets is Sport BC's investment in a balanced managed mutual fund with a fair value of \$3,854,281 at March 31, 2025 (2024 – \$3,538,706) – almost \$1.5 million more than its initial cost value of \$2,450,00 with an annualized return of 6.2% since inception. The fund has approximately 61% of its portfolio invested in a mix of Canadian and international equity securities, 33% in fixed income instruments, and 6% in cash equivalents.

Total consolidated revenue for FY2025 was \$3.9 million vs \$3.1 million in the previous fiscal year, an increase of \$0.8 million due mainly to:

- Insurance revenue +\$28k, a nominal increase from prior year;
- Corporate support & fundraising +\$458k largely based on KidSport's 50/50 draw partnership with the Vancouver Whitecaps and a \$220k estate gift to benefit KidSport BC;
- Provincial funding +\$587k comprised of increases in KidSport funding (+\$448k), Kids-in-Sport Whitecaps grant (+\$100k), and sport philanthropy (+\$59k) offset by a decrease of \$20k related to Provincial Funding Program initiatives;
- Other government support -\$165 on Canadian Sport for All Initiative funding in FY2024 that was not received in 2025;
- Net investment income -\$41k on lower capital gains and other distributions from the investment fund vs the prior year; and
- Fees for service and membership dues combined +\$10k on increased payroll activity and changes in membership.


Sport Fund

The BC Amateur Sport Fund is a chapter of the Canadian Council of Provincial and Territorial Sports Federations, a registered Canadian amateur athletic association (RCAAA). BCASF can issue an official tax receipt for qualifying donations. This provides the opportunity to solicit support for amateur sport projects.

The Fund enables Sport BC members and their clubs to diversify their revenue streams through fundraising from private sources including individuals, corporations, and foundations. Sport organizations may register a project with the Fund, allowing them to solicit donations to benefit their approved project. Projects can support operating, program-specific, capital (e.g., facilities, equipment) and scholarship/bursary costs, or any combination of these areas.

2024 CALENDAR HIGHLIGHTS

Contributions totaling \$2,626,212 across 150 projects (2023 - \$1,748,899 over 119 projects) 1,409 contributions for an average size of \$1,864 (2023 – 1,380 with an average donation size of \$1,380).

PAYROLL AND BENEFITS SERVICES

Sport BC provides top-of-the-line payroll and group benefit services to our members and affiliates at competitive rates. Sport BC provides these services on a break-even basis without an intent to earn profit.

Payroll services include:

- Direct deposit into each employees' bank account;
- WCB reporting and remittances;
- Retirement account contributions and matching per client policy;
- T4 and T4A filings;
- Statutory deductions and remittances to clients' RP accounts;
- CRA Authorized Representative services to administer clients' RP accounts if requested.

For group benefits, we provide the following services:

- Administration of comprehensive benefit package through Canada Life including:
 - Life insurance;
 - Accidental death & dismemberment (AD&D) coverage;
 - Critical illness coverage;
 - Employee assistance program (EAP);
 - o Short-term and long-term disability (STD and LTD); and
 - extended health and dental, including Consult+, a virtual health & wellness clinic.

In calendar 2024, Sport BC provided payroll services to 61 PSOs and clubs (2023 – 64), processing total payroll almost \$21.3 million for 574 employees (2023 – \$19.5 million for 554 employees).

Sport BC also administered extended benefits through Canada Life for 214 plan participants for 44 PSOs and clubs (2023 – 204 participants with 47 PSOs and clubs).

We look forward to continuing to offer our clients an exceptional level of service going forward and doing what we can to assist in an ever-changing labour market landscape. In September 2024, we distributed Sport BC's 2024 Sport Sector Talent Survey to our members which included insights on sector compensation, benefits, and organizational structure, building on the study released in 2022. We aim to continue this biannual study in 2026.





Sport BC owns SBC Insurance Agencies Ltd. (SBCI), a full-service retail insurance brokerage. During the mid-1980's liability insurance markets experienced a major crisis resulting in substantial price increases, reduction in coverage and limitations of coverage. SBCI has been providing insurance coverages for Sport BC's members and various NSOs and additional provincial and national sport clients for over 30 years.

As the only non-profit owned insurance brokerage in Canada, SBCI proudly supports a wide range of clients and the team works hard to provide high-level of service and competitive pricing. As a full service insurance brokerage, SBCI can work with various Canadian insurance companies ensuring clients can be confident we have the right products and pricing for their needs.

SBCI continues to support the sport sector in British Columbia and across Canada, by providing quality risk management and insurance advice, which assists clients to select appropriate coverages to protect it's sport/business operations. During these challenging times for amateur sport, feeling assured that proper coverages at competitive pricing is available from a trusted supplier, is the basis for the services provided from SBCI.







A NEW ERA FOR KIDSPORT BC

Looking at the last decade of grants, the following chart illustrates the number of grants and dollars distributed since 2014. In the previous 6 years before the pandemic (2014-2019) grant numbers remained relatively steady, while dollars distributed saw marginal annual increases, totaling approximately 30% over the 6-year period. This is in stark contrast to recent years when grant totals increased at a much more rapid rate, effectively doubling from 2022 to 2024.

Attendees explored key topics such as Philanthropy and Fundraising, Sources of Support, Planning and Implementation, the Power of Collaboration, and Impactful Storytelling. Thank you to the Province of B.C. for funding these learning opportunities.



ADVOCACY

Sport BC takes its role as an independent voice for amateur sport in the province seriously. Through our Advocacy Working Group and discussions with stakeholders, we work to advance concerns of the sector and ensure sport is on the agenda with key decision makers. In a summer survey 89% of Sport BC members who responded shared they are very satisfied with our advocacy efforts on their behalf.

Over the period of the Annual Report, the primary focus has been leading a collaborative effort for the October provincial election. We greatly appreciate everyone who participated in the campaign, and trust the campaign had an impact. The BC Greens, and the BC NDP included commitments to supporting and enhancing investments in amateur sport, as well as plans for investing in infrastructure. We also worked hard to communicate with the Conservative Party of BC.

Our efforts led to 2,200+ letters and Sport Champions connecting with 259 candidates, from the 3 major parties, and also independents, seeking election in 80 different ridings. After the new cabinet was sworn in on November 18 and the new Minister of Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport is Spencer Chandra Herbert, Sport BC reached out on behalf of membership and has worked to establish a strong relationship.
