## **Sport BC Members,**

I am proud to share Sport BC's Annual Report with our members and colleagues in the amateur sport sector. Sport BC remains focused on supporting our members as they deliver amateur sport across British Columbia. Our membership of provincial, multi, and disability sport, and sport-supporting organizations continues to play a vital role in strengthening communities through participation, leadership, and connection.

Sport BC's vision is that sport is thriving through the leadership of our members. This year, that vision was reflected in new opportunities for collaboration, continued program growth, and a shared commitment to ensuring that sport remains accessible, sustainable, and impactful in every corner of the province.

A key highlight for the year was the significant accomplishment this year was the continued success of the BC Amateur Sport Fund. Through expanded education opportunities offered throughout British Columbia, the program achieved a record \$8,059,234 raised in 2025, bringing the total raised through the fund over the past 10 years to more than \$20 million. This milestone reflects both the strength of the program and the growing commitment across the sector to building sustainable support for amateur sport and maximizing the opportunity afforded by sport philanthropy.

KidSport also continued to meet unprecedented demand, with fundraising efforts keeping pace with the growing need for support. In 2025, KidSport BC distributed \$3.57 million to 10,933 children across 53 sports and 1,189 amateur sport clubs - an average of 29 children supported each day. This year also included a recent forum with the KidSport volunteer network, creating valuable opportunities to strengthen connection and alignment across the province.

An exciting new initiative for the year was the inaugural Sport Event Exchange BC 2025. This one-day conference brought together more than 150 attendees from across the amateur sport sector to collaborate on sport hosting and other shared priorities. The positive response to this first event demonstrated the value of creating space for our sector to come together, exchange ideas, and build new opportunities. Planning is already underway for an expanded Sport Event Exchange BC in November 2026, and we look forward to working again with our partners Richmond Sport Hosting and Toa Consulting.

Other efforts over the course of the year have supported the goals outlined in our strategic plan and responded to the evolving needs of our members.

Specific accomplishments include:

- Hosting sector and community-based recognition opportunities, specifically the Sport BC Athlete of the Year Awards, the Presidents' Awards, Community Sport Hero Awards, In Her Footsteps ... Celebrating BC Women and Sport, and Bobbie Steen Legacy Foundation Award. Launching a new revenue opportunity for our members, Victory Vault, introduced to the market in December 2025, to help strengthen participating organizations' sustainability.
- Continuing to prioritize advocacy through an active Advocacy Working Group, with a focus on provincial budget consultation and prioritizing sector-wide issues.
- Maintaining strong province-wide programs and services through KidSport, the BC Amateur Sport Fund, insurance, and other initiatives that directly support our members and communities.

The accomplishments highlighted in this Annual Report are possible because of the dedication of our outstanding staff team, whose commitment ensures a high level of service and support for our members and clients. I would also like to thank our Board of Directors for their leadership, vision, and continued support, as well as our many partners, sponsors, donors, and stakeholders across the sport sector whose collaboration, investment, and belief in our work help to make this progress possible.

Thank you to our members and friends in the sport sector for participating in our programs, sharing your expertise, and continuing to champion the power of sport in British Columbia. We are proud to be part of your team and look forward to the year ahead.

# FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This financial summary and the table above are based on the review engagement consolidated financial statements of Sport BC and SBC Insurance Ltd. for the years ended March 31, 2026 and 2025. The financial statements and accompanying notes are available on our website at SportBC.com.

Sport BC realized a net operating surplus of \$190,207 for its fiscal year ended March 31, 2026 (2025 – \$206,401) and total excess of revenues over expenses of \$273,429 (2025 – \$432,457) and ended its fiscal year with net assets of \$6,282,724 (2025 – \$6,009,295). Included in net assets is Sport BC's investment in a balanced managed mutual fund with a fair value of \$4,099,182 at March 31, 2025 (2025 – \$3,854,281) – more than \$1.6 million more than its initial cost value of \$2,450,00 with an annualized return of 6.7% since inception. The fund has approximately 61% of its portfolio invested in a mix of Canadian and international equity securities, 35% in fixed income instruments, and 4% in cash equivalents.

Total consolidated revenue for FY2026 was \$4.5 million vs \$3.9 million in the previous fiscal year, an increase of \$0.6 million due mainly to:

- Insurance revenue +\$21k, a nominal increase from prior year;
- Corporate support & fundraising +\$346k based on gross Victory Vault proceeds of \$550k offset by slight decline in KidSport revenues;
- Provincial funding +\$228k comprised of increases in KidSport funding (+\$193k), sport philanthropy (+\$3k) and \$32k related to Provincial Funding Program initiatives;
- Net investment income +14k on moderately higher capital gains and other distributions from the investment fund vs the prior year offset by a decline in interest income on lower rates; and

Expenses totalled \$4.4 million, an increase of \$625k vs fiscal 2025 driven mainly by:

- KidSport + \$71k on grants grants and operational costs;
- Provincial Funding Initiative costs +\$32k on increased programming activity;
- Kids-in-Sport Whitecaps initiative -\$100k and sport philanthropy +\$3k;
- Insurance operations +\$77k on increased staff, overhead, and commission costs offset by a \$8k decrease in income taxes; and

The BC Amateur Sport Fund is a chapter of the Canadian Council of Provincial and Territorial Sports Federations, a registered Canadian amateur athletic association (RCAAA). BCASF can issue an official tax receipt for qualifying donations. This provides the opportunity to solicit support for amateur sport projects.

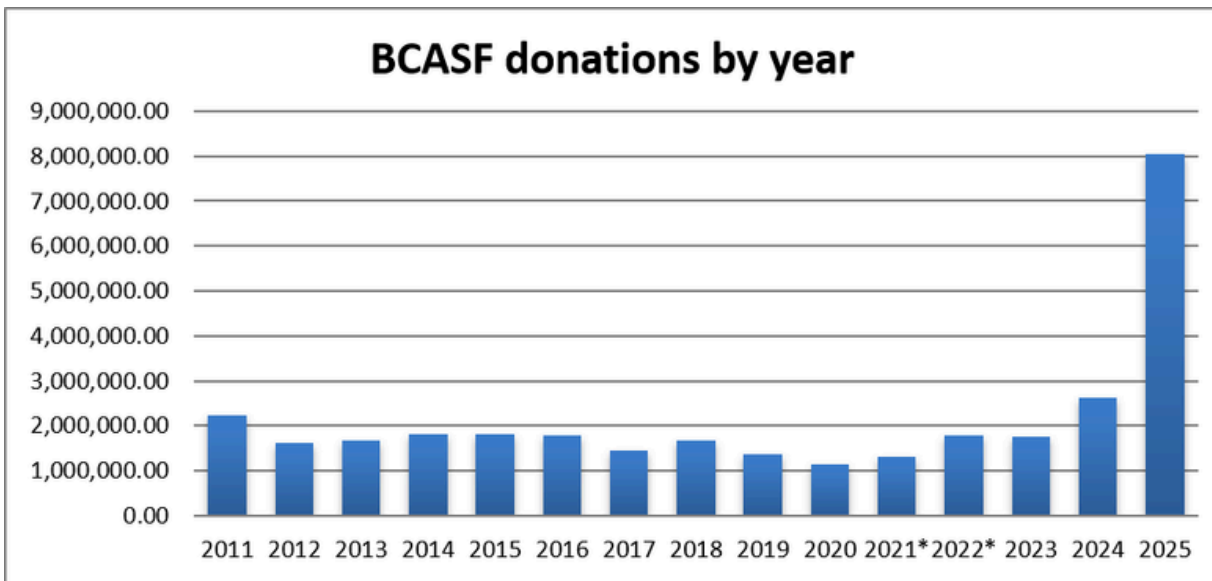
The Fund enables Sport BC members and their clubs to diversify their revenue streams through fundraising from private sources including individuals, corporations, and foundations. Sport organizations may register a project with the Fund, allowing them to solicit donations to benefit their approved project. Projects can support operating, program-specific, capital (e.g., facilities, equipment) and scholarship/bursary costs, or any combination of these areas.

## 2025 CALENDAR HIGHLIGHTS

Contributions totaling \$8,059,235 across 180 projects (2024 - \$2,626,212 over 150 projects) 2,023 contributions for an average size of \$3,984 (2024 - 1,409 with an average donation size of \$1,864). BCASF realized an absolutely incredible year in 2025, building on the sport philanthropy workshops that took place across the province in 2024. The contribution total of \$8.1 million far surpasses BCASF's previous best year of \$2.6 million in 2024. There were two significant transaction that need mention:

- 1) \$3.0 million in contributions from the Paul Meyers Family Foundation to benefit the West Vancouver Football Club and their project to construct an all-season sport bubble soccer facility; and
- 2) A \$1.7 million private donor contribution to benefit the Peach Arch Curling Club and their need for facility and equipment upgrades.

These two contributions account for more than half of the year's total, but it's important to note that even without these contributions, BCASF would still have raised about \$3.5 million. 2025 saw a total 2,023 transactions over 180 projects vs 1,409 transactions over 150 projects in 2024, demonstrating a strong level of overall support for sport philanthropy across an increasing number of projects.

# PAYROLL AND BENEFITS SERVICES

Sport BC provides top-of-the-line payroll and group benefit services to our members and affiliates at competitive rates. Sport BC provides these services on a break-even basis without an intent to earn profit.

Payroll services include:

- Direct deposit into each employees' bank account;
- WCB reporting and remittances;
- Retirement account contributions and matching per client policy;
- T4 and T4A filings;
- Statutory deductions and remittances to clients' RP accounts;
- CRA Authorized Representative services to administer clients' RP accounts if requested.

For group benefits, we provide the following services:

- Administration of comprehensive benefit package through Canada Life including:
  1. Life insurance
  2. Accidental death & dismemberment (AD&D) coverage
  3. Critical illness coverage
  4. Employee assistance program (EAP)
  5. Short-term and long-term disability (STD and LTD)
  6. extended health and dental, including Consult+, a virtual health & wellness clinic;

In calendar 2025, Sport BC provided payroll services to 63 PSOs and clubs (2023 – 61), processing total payroll almost \$22.3 million for 829 employees & contractors (2024 – \$21.3 million for 794 employees & contractors). Sport BC also administered extended benefits through Canada Life for 214 plan participants for 44 PSOs and clubs (2024 – 214 participants with 44 PSOs and clubs).

We look forward to continuing to offer our clients an exceptional level of service going forward and doing what we can to assist in an ever-changing labour market landscape. In September 2024, we distributed Sport BC's 2024 Sport Sector Talent Survey to our members which included insights on sector compensation, benefits, and organizational structure, building on the study released in 2022. We will continue to provide our members with valuable insights in the 2026 edition.



Sport BC owns SBC Insurance Agencies Ltd. (SBCI), a full-service retail insurance brokerage. As a full service insurance brokerage, SBCI can work with various Canadian insurance companies ensuring clients can be confident we have the right products and pricing for their needs.

SBCI continues to support the sport sector in British Columbia and across Canada, by providing quality risk management and insurance advice, which assists clients to select appropriate coverages to protect it's sport/business operations. During these challenging times for amateur sport, feeling assured that proper coverages at competitive pricing is available from a trusted supplier, is the basis for the services provided from SBCI.

Knowing that the profits of SBCI are invested back into the delivery of programs and services, delivered by Sport BC, to support it's membership, is a compelling reason why so many of Sport BC members choose to support this model.

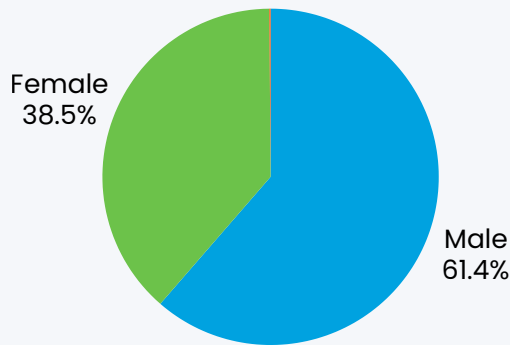

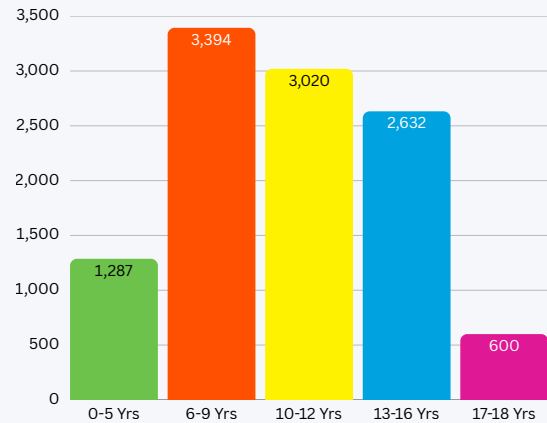

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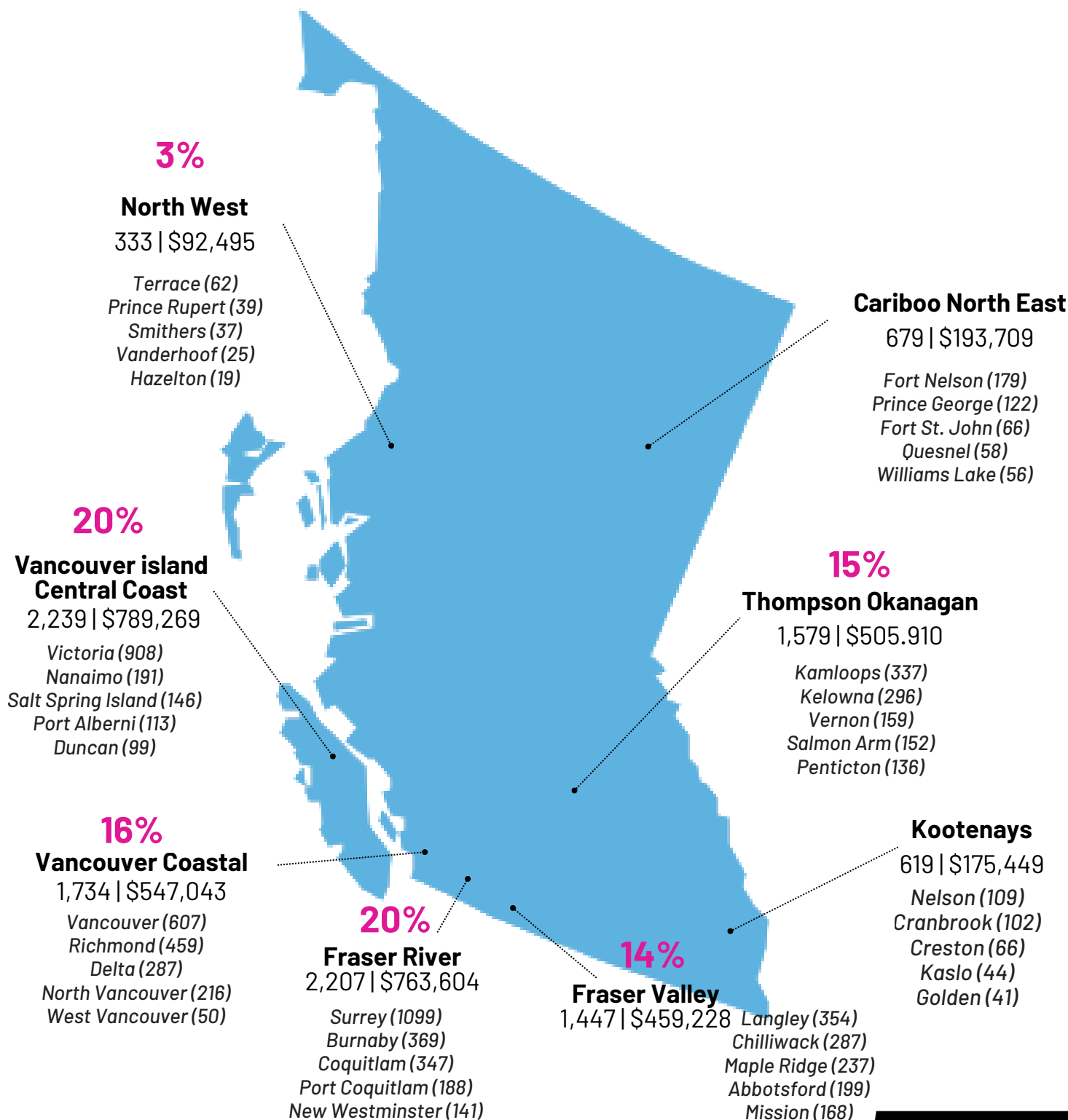

SPORT EVENT EXCHANGE BC

In November 2025, Sport BC collaborated with Toa Consulting and Richmond Sport Hosting to deliver the inaugural Sport Event Exchange BC. This one-day sport tourism industry forum brought together destination marketing organizations, municipalities, provincial and national sport organizations, disability sport organizations, sport event rights holders, and venue owners and operators from across British Columbia.

As a first-of-its-kind event in the province, the forum was designed to strengthen collaboration, build capacity, and create new opportunities in sport event hosting. Attendees participated in engaging panel discussions, networking sessions, and knowledge-sharing opportunities focused on developing partnerships between the sport and tourism sectors.

The event was a great success, fostering valuable connections, meaningful dialogue, and increased understanding of the collective opportunities available to grow sport event hosting throughout British Columbia. The positive feedback received from participants highlighted the value of bringing industry leaders together to share experiences, challenges, and innovative ideas.

Building on the momentum of the inaugural event, Sport BC and its partners look forward to hosting Sport Event Exchange BC again in November 2026 and continuing to strengthen collaboration across the province's sport and tourism communities.



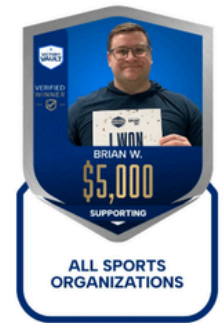
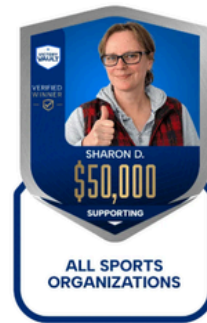
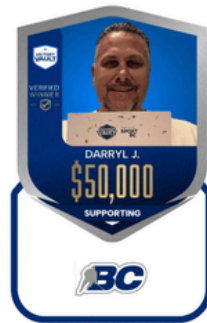


# VICTORY VAULT BC
